Elements of Culture

- Symbols
- Language
- Gestures
- Norms
- Sanctions
- Values

Symbolic Meaning

Symbol: Something to which people attach meaning, and use as a basis for communication

Language: A system of symbols that can be combined in an infinite number of ways to communicate with others.

Gesture: Using one's body to communicate with others, conveying meaning without words

Normative Controls

Norm: An expectation or rule of behavior that derives from a group's values

Sanction: Positive or negative reactions to the ways in which people observe or adhere to norms

Law: Formal norms enforced by the state

Mores: The strongest norms that elicit the harshest sanctions, and that reflect society's most cherished principles

Folkways: Informal norms that govern everyday behavior

Values

Value: A group's collective ideas about what is worthwhile or desirable in life; standards by which a group defines what is good and bad, right and wrong, beautiful and ugly, etc.

Values shape individual preferences and choices
