

Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program

The School of Nursing combines study in the liberal arts, life sciences and behavioral sciences with the study of nursing to offer the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. The purposes of the School of Nursing are to prepare practitioners of nursing to meet the health care needs of the people of Mississippi and to provide a foundation in the study of nursing sufficient to support graduate study should the student elect to continue her or his education beyond the baccalaureate level. Students who receive the BSN from Delta State are eligible to write the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) for licensure as registered nurses (R.N.).

Qualified students are admitted to the school each Spring semester. Admission is competitive.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR THE GENERIC BSN:

- 1. Apply to Delta State University and meet admission requirements as outlined in the Delta State University Bulletin.
- 2. Complete all non-nursing support courses as outlined in the Delta Sate University Bulletin or in this brochure with a 2.5 or better GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Make a grade of "C" or better in all pre-requisite courses.
- 4. As part of the admission selection process, each potential candidate for the BSN Program will complete a nurse entrance assessment test.
- 5. Submit the following information to the School of Nursing by October 1 prior to the first in which nursing courses begin. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all of the following materials are received in the School of Nursing Office.
 - A. School of Nursing application
 - B. Proof of Admission to Delta State University
- 6. Official American College Test (ACT) scores. (<u>It is the student's responsibility</u> to insure that the ACT score is sent to the School of Nursing.) ACT Scores printed on transcripts and not specifically designated "National Testing" are not considered official.

Achieve an ACT composite score of 21 if taken after October 1989, and 18 if taken prior to October, 1989. A. Transcripts from all colleges previously attended. Students are responsible for having all

- transcripts, including DSU transcripts, sent to the School of Nursing.
- B. Evaluation of transcripts. This is to be done by the REGISTRAR prior to admission to Delta State University.
- C. Three references (at least one must be academic) using School of Nursing forms & criteria.
- 7. All Candidates for degrees must pass either the Writing Proficiency Examination, English 301 or earn a score of 3.0 or better on the CAAP prior to admission to the School of Nursing.
- After being accepted for admission, each student will be required to submit a completed health and immunization form provided by the School of Nursing, evidence of personal health insurance and CPR certification before the first day of class.
- Students may be required to complete an interview and onsite writing sample.
